The Morristown City Council has passed an ordinance amending the city's Master Fee Schedule. Said changes to the Master Fee Schedule shall be effective January 2, 2024.

WHEREAS, the City of Morristown on behalf of its Prosecuting Attorney and Police Department desires to enter into Joint Powers Agreements with the State of Minnesota, Department of Public Safety, Bureau of Criminal Apprehension to use systems and tools available over the State's criminal justice data communications network for which the City is eligible. The Joint Powers Agreements further provide the City with the ability to add, modify and delete connectivity, systems and tools over the five year life of the agreement and obligates the City to pay the costs for the network connection.

The City Clerk shall also cause mailed notice to be given to the owner of each parcel described in the assessment roll not less than two weeks prior to the hearing.
- 6. The owner of any property so assessed may, at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the Rice County Property Tax and Elections Director, pay the whole of the assessment on such property with interest accrued to the date of payment, to

the City Clerk, except that no interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid by October 31, 2024. He may at any time thereafter, pay to the City Clerk the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 15 or interest will be charged through December 31 of the succeeding year.
